Shape Up for Sinai!

Roads, parks and off-road trails are bustling with runners all shaping up for summer, which is why Wind Sand & Stars is offering the chance to channel all that hard training to running the Sharm half marathon this coming November. This unique challenge incorporates a 21.09km mixed terrain race within the beautiful UNESCO Ras Mohammed National Park in South Sinai.

Whilst skirting the turquoise waters of the Red Sea, you'll be running in the company of herons and fishing eagles with your every pace helping to support Bedouin Communities through South Sinai's very first Community Foundation.

Fay Cox explains "we have been working with the same Bedouin tribes for over 20 years. Whilst we offer fun, challenging and educational journeys to those who travel with us, we have also been providing direct employment and have delivered a number of local development projects, underpinning our strong commitment to small-scale, grass roots development."

Integral to this journey is the privilege of spending a night in the desert with our longstanding Bedouin friends, and a chance to see the community project that a percentage of your journey fee will have contributed to.

The journey includes: Bedouin community project donation, flights, acclimatisation, 7 nights in a four-star resort, local transport, travel insurance, full board and a 2 day, 1 night desert interior excursion.

As well as school groups we ran two adult journeys and our last departure of the season introduced Cambridge scholar and author Professor Janet Soskice as guest speaker for the Historical Odyssey, "Janet's presence's made the journey so meaningful. Her remarkable knowledge and storytelling helped make the journey unforgettable".

We are now looking ahead to our autumn departures with a wonderful mix of experiences on offer from the Adventure Into Silence in October, to a gruelling desert half marathon in November.
